PREFACE

Labour is included in the concurrent list of the Constitution and both the Union and the State Governments are empowered to legislate on it. There are Central and State Legislations on many aspects of labour such as employment, wages, working condition, industrial relations, social security, labour welfare and so on.

Rapid industrial development and changed economic scenario have necessitated the availability of reliable database for formulation of progressive labour policies to improve working conditions of labour, ensure adequate safety measures and to promote health and welfare of the workers employed in factories and evaluate their implementation. The present report contains comprehensive statistical information on the working of the Registered Factories in India based on the Annual Returns/Reports received from the responding States/Union Territories pertaining to the year 2016.

The Rules framed under the Factories Act, 1948 impose obligations on the employers of the registered factories to submit Annual Returns in the prescribed format to the Chief Inspectors of Factories/Labour Commissioners of their respective States/Union Territories. These State/U.T. authorities in turn furnish consolidated data in respect of the entire State/Union Territory in the prescribed proformae, to the Labour Bureau along with a detailed annual report on the working of the Factories Act, 1948. The Labour Bureau compiles and disseminates these Statistics at all India level. It may be mentioned here that the data of employment in respect of factories not submitting returns to the concerned state authorities are estimates prepared by these authorities.

I am thankful to the responding State/UT Governments without whose support it would not have been possible to bring out this Report. I also place on record my appreciation of the work done by the team of officers and staff members of the Labour Bureau.

The views expressed, if any, are not necessarily those of the Ministry of Labour & Employment, Government of India. I urge the readers to send their suggestions for further improvement of future issues of this publication.

Summary of the Report

The Factories Act, 1948 is a Labour welfare legislation which was enacted with the prime objective of protecting workmen employed in factories against industrial and occupational hazards. It imposes upon the owners and occupiers obligations to protect the workers. The current edition presents detailed report on implementation of Factories Act, 1948 during the year 2016. The main highlights of the report are as follows: -

Growth of Factories

- There is a decrease of 2.07 per cent in the number of total registered factories i.e. from 2,21,758 in the beginning of the year to 2,17,157 at the end of the year 2016 (Table 1.1).
- Of the total registered factories, the percentage of working factories was 76.91 per cent (Table 1.1).
- The number of factories submitting returns was 48,727 i.e. 29.17 per cent of the total registered working factories (Table 1.1).

Average Daily Employment in Factories and its Distribution

- The major proportion of working factories i.e. 77.83 per cent as well as employment i.e. 95.57 per cent was reported under section 2m(i) of the Factories Act, 1948 (Table 2.4).
- Share of working factories under Public Sector was 2.11 per cent whereas in Private sector it was 97.89 per cent (Table 2 .5).
- Adult men constituted 76.31 per cent of the total average daily employment in the working factories (submitting return) whereas adult women and adolescents were 23.61 per cent and 0.08 per cent respectively (Table 2.12).
- About 7.23 per cent of the total average number of workers employed daily in the working factories were employed in the factories carrying on dangerous operations (Table 1.3 & 1.4).
- About 69.06 per cent of the working factories were employing less than 50 workers (Table 2.7 & Table 2.8).
- About 80.91 per cent of the total number of factories submitting returns worked for more than 240 days (Table 2.9 & 2.10).

Hours of Work

- Normal weekly hours of work for most of the adult men (64.41 per cent) and women (46.14 per cent) were in the range of 45 – 48 hours (Table 3.1 & 3.2).

- About 17.51 per cent of adult men and 22.19 per cent adult women were putting in above 48 hours of work per day (Table -3.1 & Table 3.2).

Leave and Holidays

- Out of total number of persons who were entitled to annual leave with wages, about 84.68 per cent were granted leave (Table-4.1).

Industrial Injuries

- Total Injuries (fatal and non-fatal) have decreased by 28.98 per cent i.e. from 5500 in 2015 to 3906 in 2016 (Table-5.1). **
- Frequency rate of injuries per one lakh mandays worked has increased from 0.33 during 2015 to 0.51 during 2016 (Table-5.1). **
- Incidence rate per thousand average daily employment declined from 0.64 in 2015 to 0.42 in 2016 (Table 5.1). **
- Out of the total injuries (fatal and non-fatal) reported, about 95.88 per cent were in case of men and about 4.12 per cent were related to women. (Table 5.2 & 5.3).
- Severity rate of mandays lost due to injuries per one lakh mandays worked has increased from 6.22 in 2015 to 17.11 in 2016 (Table 5.6). **

Inspections

- Out of total factories inspected, 75.17 per cent factories were inspected only once and rest were inspected twice or more (Table 9.1).

Convictions

- Out of the total 9203 Convictions, 1922 Convictions i.e. 20.88 per cent pertained to the offences relating to Safety Provisions. (Table 9.3).

CHAPTER – 1

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE FACTORIES ACT, 1948

Labour being in the concurrent list of the Indian Constitution, data on various aspects of labour is collected both by Central and State Governments. Most of the data are by product of the administration of various labour laws. The Factories Act, 1948 is one such Act, which came into force on 01.04.1949 and is applicable to the whole of India excluding four States/Union Territories namely, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Sikkim and Lakshadweep.

1. OBJECTIVE

The main objective of the Act is to ensure adequate safety measures and to promote health and welfare of the workers employed in factories to protect the workers against industrial occupational hazards as well as to prevent the workers from being subject to unduly long hours of bodily strain and manual labour. The Act is meant to provide protection to the workers from being exploited and also provides for improvement of the working conditions within the factory premises.

2. COVERAGE

The coverage of the Act is confined to: -

- (a) factories using power and employing 10 or more workers on any working day of the preceding twelve months;
- (b) factories not using power and employing 20 or more workers on any working day of the preceding twelve months; and
- (c) factories specially notified under Section 85 of the Act by the Governments of State/Union Territories.

2. IMPORTANT CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

(a) Factory means any premises including the precincts thereof:-

- i) wherein ten or more workers are working or were working on any day of the preceding twelve months and in any part of which a manufacturing process is being carried on with the aid of power, or is ordinarily so carried on or

- ii) wherein twenty or more workers are working or were working on any day of the preceding twelve months and in any part of which a manufacturing process is being carried on without the aid of power or is ordinarily so carried on.

(b) Worker means a person employed directly or by or through any agency (including a contractor) with or without the knowledge of the principal employer, whether for remuneration or not in any manufacturing process or in cleaning any part of the machinery or premises used for a manufacturing process or in any kind of work incidental to or connected with the manufacturing process or the subject of manufacturing process [but does not include any member of the armed forces of the Union].

(c) Manufacturing Process means any process for: -

- i) Making, altering, repairing, ornamenting, finishing, packing, oiling, washing, cleaning, breaking up, demolishing or otherwise treating or adapting any article or substance with a view to its use, sale, transport, delivery or disposal or
- ii) Pumping oil, water, sewage or any other substance or
- iii) Generating, transforming or transmitting power or
- iv) Composing types for printing, printing by letter press, lithography, photogravure or other similar process or book binding,
- v) Constructing, reconstructing, repairing, refitting, finishing or breaking up ships or vessels,
- vi) Preserving or storing any article in cold storage.

(d) Hazardous Process means any process or activity in relation to an industry specified in the First Schedule where, unless special care is taken, raw materials used therein or the intermediate or finished products, by- products, wastes or effluents thereof would:

- (i) cause material impairment of the health of the persons engaged in or connected therewith, or
- (ii) result in the pollution of the general environment,

Provided that the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, amend the First Schedule by way of addition, omission or variation of any industry specified in the said Schedule.

- (e) Fatal Injury means injury resulting from industrial accident which caused death of the worker.
- (f) Non-Fatal Injury means injury resulting from an industrial accident, which prevented injured worker from attending to the work for a period of 48 hours or more immediately following the injury.
- (g) Adult means a person who has completed his eighteenth year of age.
- (h) Adolescent means a person who has completed his fifteenth year of age but has not completed his eighteenth year.
- (i) Child means a person who has not completed his fifteenth year of age.
- (j) Average Number of Workers Employed Daily is calculated by dividing the aggregate number of attendance on all the working days (that is, mandays worked) by the number of working days in the year. Attendance on separate shifts (e.g. night and day shifts) should be counted separately. Days on which the factory was closed for whatever cause and days on which the manufacturing process was not carried on should not be treated as working days. Partial attendance for less than half a shift on a working day should be ignored, while attendance for half a shift or more on such day should be treated as full attendance.
- (k) Mandays Worked means total number of attendance on working days during a calendar year.
- (l) Average Number of Hours Worked per week means the total actual hours worked by all workers during the year excluding the rest intervals but including overtime worked divided by the product of average number of workers employed daily in the factory and 52 weeks. In case the factory has not worked for the whole year, the number of weeks during which the factory worked would be used in place of 52.

- (m) Limitations of the data: The following States/U.Ts have not Submitted their returns for the year 2016 despite repeated reminders or have Submitted defective returns and are, therefore, excluded.

CHAPTER – 2

DISTRIBUTION OF FACTORIES

2.1 This chapter provides data relating to the total number of factories on register at the beginning of the year, the number of factories registered and de-registered during the year, number of working factories with estimated average daily employment, number of working factories submitting returns by size of employment, number of days worked and their distribution by public and private sectors.

2.2 The details of registered factories by States/Union Territories for the year 2016 have been presented in Table 1.1. This table shows that the total number of factories on register declined by 2.07 per cent from 221758 in the beginning of the year 2016 to 217157 at the end of the year 2016. While 8880 new factories were registered during the year 2016, the number of factories de-registered from the register during the same period was 13481. Of the total number of factories on register at the end of the year 2016, 76.91 per cent factories were reported as working.

2.3 Number of the working factories and estimated average daily employment by States and Industries for the year 2016 has been presented in Table 1.2. During 2016, the industry group 'Manufacture of Food Products' (Industry Code 10) accounted for 18.61 per cent of the total number of working factories, followed by the 'Manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products' (Industry Code 23) which accounted for 10.86 per cent. The highest estimated average daily employment was reported for industry group 'Manufacture of Food Products' (Industry Code 10) which was 10.91 per cent of the total estimated average employment, followed by the 'Manufacture of textiles' (Industry Code 13) which accounted for 9.59 per cent.

2.4 The number of factories carrying on operations declared dangerous under Section 87 of the Factories Act, 1948 by States and by Industries has been shown in Tables 1.3 and 1.4 respectively. The proportion of average daily number of workers employed in dangerous operations to total average daily number of workers employed in working factories worked out to be 7.23 per cent in the year 2016. As revealed from Table 1.3, the maximum number of working factories carrying on dangerous operations was reported by Telangana followed by Madhya Pradesh.

2.5 The employers of registered factories are required to submit annual returns in the prescribed form under the Factories Act, 1948 to the Chief Inspector of Factories of their respective States/Union Territories, who, in turn furnish the consolidated data in respect of the entire State/Union Territory in the prescribed proformae to the Labour Bureau. Some of the factories, however, do not submit their returns. Thus the factories are divided into two categories i.e. (i) those submitting returns and (ii) others not-submitting returns. The data on working

factories submitting returns are given in Table 1.1. It shows that 29.17 per cent of the total working factories submitted the annual returns in prescribed format under the Factories Act, 1948 for the year 2016. The response rate was highest in Tamil Nadu at 83.05 followed by A. & N. Islands at 81.25 per cent and Goa at 70.98 per cent. The lowest response rate was in Nagaland, reported at 0.45 per cent, followed by Jharkhand at 0.87 per cent and Bihar at 2.2 per cent. The break-up of working factories into those submitting and not- submitting returns by states and industries are given in Table 2.1 and Table 2.2. When analyzed by industries, 'Manufacture of Food Products' industry (Industry Code 10) ranked first with 15.52 per cent of the total factories submitting returns, followed by 'Manufacture of chemicals and chemical products' (Industry Code 20) at 10.92 per cent w.r.t. working factories submitting returns.

2.6 Distribution of working factories submitting returns by size of employment during the years 2011 to 2016 has been given in Table 2(i) below. It shows that the percentage of factories (submitting returns) was 69 per cent, for factories employing less than 50 workers during the year 2016.

2.7 The distribution of working factories (submitting returns) according to number of days actually worked during the years 2011 to 2016 is presented in Table 2(ii). It shows that maximum of the total factories (submitting returns) i.e. 80.91 per cent worked for more than 240 days during the year 2016. During the previous year's also a similar trend was observed.

CHAPTER-3

AVERAGE DAILY EMPLOYMENT

3.1 The statistics collected under the Factories Act, 1948 relate to workers as defined under the Act, i.e. persons employed directly or through any agency, whether for wages or not in any manufacturing process or in cleaning any part of machinery or premises used for manufacturing process or any other kind of work incidental to or connected with manufacturing process. The definition covers not only workers but also those supervisory and clerical personnel who are connected with manufacturing processes. Further, the coverage is limited to factories as defined in the Factories Act, 1948, viz., a) factories using power and employing 10 or more workers on any working day (Section 2m (i)), b) factories not using power and employing 20 or more workers on any working day (Section 2m (ii)) and c) factories specially notified under Section 85 of the Factories Act by the State Government.

3.2 The employment data which represent average daily employment are furnished by each factory by dividing total attendance (man days worked) in a year by the total number of working days during the year. The estimated employment for factories not submitting returns is obtained by the State authorities on the basis of following in order of their preference:-

- i) recent factory inspection reports
- ii) last year's employment data
- iii) employment figures reported in the application for registration or grant or renewal of license.

3.3 The average daily employment for an industry group or a State is obtained by summing up the reported and estimated figures of average daily employment for all factories belonging to an industry or a State.

3.4 Table 2.1 depicts estimated average daily employment in all the working factories by States/U.T.s in the responding states during 2016. The total estimated average daily employment was 9.33 million in the year 2016. The estimated average daily employment in the factories submitting returns accounted for 45.85 per cent of the total estimated average daily employment in the total working factories. The average daily employment per working factory worked out to be 55.89 at all India level. It was highest in Odisha (123.34) and lowest in Nagaland (13.89).

3.5 Estimated average daily employment by Industry Groups at two digit level and by States/Industry Groups at three-digit level of National Industrial Classification, 2008 has been presented in Tables 2.2 and 2.3 respectively. These tables reveal that Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Haryana, Tamil Nadu and Telangana together accounted for 63.90 per cent of the total working factories and the bulk of employment i.e. 61.46 per cent of the total employment. Amongst the industry groups, the average daily employment per working factory was the highest i.e. 356.52 in the Manufacture of other transport equipment (Industry Code 30) and the lowest i.e. 6.00 was in Insurance, reinsurance and pension funding, except compulsory social security (Industry Code 65).

3.6 State-wise number of working factories and estimated average daily employment covered under Section 2m (i), 2m (ii) and notified under Section 85 of the Factories Act, 1948 have been shown in table 2.4. It may be seen from this Table that a major proportion of working factories i.e. 77.83 per cent as well as employment i.e. 95.57 per cent was reported under Section 2m (i) of the Factories Act, 1948. Further, under this Section i.e. 2m(i) the share of four states viz., Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu and Telangana together constituted about 59.93 per cent of the total working factories {under 2m(i) Section} whereas in case of estimated average daily employment, these States together accounted for 52.55 per cent.

3.7 The number of working factories and estimated average daily employment by States and Industries in Public and Private Sector have been presented in Tables 2.5 and 2.6. It may be seen from these tables that factories in the Public Sector accounted for 2.11 per cent of total working factories and 9.49 per cent of the total estimated average daily employment. The Private Sector accounted for the remaining 97.89 per cent of total working factories and 90.51 per cent of the total estimated employment. Average daily employment in Public Sector was the highest i.e. 14.65 per cent in the Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (Industry Code 35). In the case of Private Sector, highest average daily employment i.e. 11.09 per cent was reported in 'Manufacture of food products (Industry Code-10).

3.8 The distribution of working factories submitting returns according to average daily number of workers employed therein as classified by States/Union Territories and by Major Industry Groups is given in Tables 2.7 and 2.8.

3.9 The number of factories submitting returns and average daily number of workers employed therein in the various employment size-groups are presented in the Table 3.(i) as under.

3.11 The distribution of working factories submitting returns classified according to number of days worked and average daily employment therein by States and Major Industry Groups is given in Tables 2.9 and 2.10. The number of working factories submitting returns as classified in various groups of working days and employment therein is given in the Table -3(iii) below.

Data presented in the above Table reveal that 80.91 per cent of the total number of working factories submitting returns worked for more than 240 days during the year 2016. Only a very small fraction of such factories i.e. 2.50 per cent worked for up to 60 days during the year 2016.

3.12 The number of mandays worked in working factories submitting returns by Industry groups and by States has been presented in Table 2.11. Taking all States combined together, the industry group 'Manufacture of food products' (Industry Code-10) accounted for maximum number of mandays worked i.e. 11.98 per cent.

3.13 Under the Factories Act, 1948, adult, adolescent and child have been clearly defined. The State-wise and Industry-wise Average Daily Employment by age-categories and sex has been presented in Tables 2.12 & 2.13 respectively. It may be seen that adult men, adult women, adolescent (male & female) and children (boys & girls) constituted 76.31 per cent, 23.61 per cent, 0.08 per cent and 0.00 of the total average daily employment respectively. Among the States, Tamil Nadu reported the highest number of workers i.e. 41.56 per cent of total average daily employment. Among the adult women workers, Tamil Nadu again reported the highest number of women workers i.e. 73.79 per cent of total women workers in the year 2016. Amongst industry groups, the maximum numbers of adult women workers i.e. 14.89 percent were employed in the industry group 'Manufacture of textiles' (Industry Code-13).

CHAPTER-4

HOURS OF WORK

4.1 Section 51 of the Factories Act, 1948 prescribes that no adult worker shall be required or allowed to work in a factory for more than forty-eight hours in any week. Further, Section 54 stipulates that subject to the provision of Section 51, no adult worker shall be required or allowed to work in a factory for more than nine hours in any day. However, there is a provision to this section which states that subject to the prior approval of the Chief Inspector of Factories, the maximum daily hours specified in Section 54 may be exceeded in order to facilitate the change of shifts.

4.2 Section 52 of the Act states that no adult worker shall be required or allowed to work in a factory on the first day of the week i.e. weekly holiday. Section 53 of the Act, further, states that if the worker is deprived of any of the weekly holidays for which provision is made in Section 52, he shall be allowed, within the month in which the holidays were due to him or within the two months immediately following that month, compensatory holidays of equal number to the holidays so lost. Section 55 of the Act lays down that the periods of work of adult workers in a factory each day shall be so fixed that no worker shall work for more than 5 hours before he has had an interval for rest of at least half an hour. The Chief Inspector of Factories can exempt any factory from this provision so that the total number of hours worked by a worker without an interval does not exceed six hours.

4.3 Section 56 of the Act stipulates that the period of work of an adult worker in a factory shall be so arranged that, inclusive of his intervals for rest under Section 55, it shall not spread over more than ten and half hours on any day. The Chief Inspector of Factories may however, increase the spread over up to twelve hours on specific grounds.

4.4 The reports received from various States/Union Territories on the working of the Factories Act, 1948 highlight satisfactory compliance with the provisions relating to hours of work.

4.5 Details pertaining to specified normal weekly hours each for adult men and adult women workers by States and Industries have been given in Tables 3.1 to 3.4. Normal weekly hours for most of the adult men and women were in the range of 45-48 hours in the factories submitting returns. The following Table presents the percentage distribution of adult workers by normal weekly hours of work.

CHAPTER-5

LEAVE AND HOLIDAYS

Section 79 of the Factories Act provides that every worker who has worked for a period of at least 240 days or more in a factory during the calendar year shall be allowed during the subsequent calendar year, leave with wages at the rate of (a) one day for every twenty days worked in the case of adults, and (b) one day for every fifteen days worked in the case of children. The leave admissible is exclusive of holidays that occur during or at either end of the leave period. Provision is also made for proportionate leave with wages for a worker who is discharged or dismissed before he has completed 240 days service. The days of lay off, by agreement or contract or as permissible under the standing orders, maternity leave in case of female workers not exceeding twelve weeks and the leave earned in the year prior to that in which leave is enjoyed shall be deemed to be the days worked in a factory for the purpose of computation of the period of 240 days or more but shall not earn leave for these days. While calculating leave, fraction of leave of half a day or more shall be treated as one full day's leave and fraction of less than half a day shall be omitted. If a worker does not take whole of leave entitled to him in any one calendar year, such leave is allowed be added to the leave to be allowed in the succeeding calendar year. The total number of days of leave that may be carried forward to the succeeding year shall not exceed thirty in case of an adult and forty in case of a child.

5.1 Sections 79 and 53 of the Factories Act, 1948 deal with the grant of annual leave with wages and compensatory holidays respectively. Rules framed by the State Governments and Union Territories require factories to furnish information relating to number of persons employed, number of persons eligible for leave and number of persons actually granted leave during the year. It has been observed from the consolidated returns received from various States/Union Territories that 84.68 per cent of the total number of persons, who were entitled to annual leave with wages, were granted leave during the year, 2016. The provisions relating to leave and compensatory holidays were reported to be generally well observed in various States/Union Territories. The statistics relating to annual leave with wages during the year 2016 is given in Table 4.1.

CHAPTER-6

INDUSTRIAL INJURIES

6.1 This chapter provides the statistics of fatal injuries and non-fatal injuries resulting from industrial accidents by reasons due to which the persons injured are prevented from attending to work for a period of forty-eight hours or more immediately following the accidents. The coverage remains limited and varies from year to year because many factories fail to submit the returns. The numbers of injuries are based on the notices of accidents to the notified authorities in a prescribed manner.

6.2 The important statistical measures for injuries are (i) Frequency Rate, (ii) the Severity Rate and (iii) Incidence Rate. The Frequency Rate is calculated by dividing the total number of injuries by corresponding number of mandays worked in lakhs. The Severity Rate, which takes into account the duration of disability as well, is calculated by dividing the number of mandays lost due to injuries by the number of mandays worked in lakhs. This rate is calculated only in respect of those non-fatal injuries in which workers returned to work during the same year. The incidence rate is calculated by dividing the number of injuries by average daily employment per thousand. The statistics are based on injuries reported in the annual returns.

6.3 The number and frequency rates of fatal, non-fatal and total injuries in factories submitting returns during the years 2003 to 2016 are given in Table-6 (i) below:

6.4 Industry-wise and State-wise figures of fatal, non-fatal and total injuries for 2016 have been shown in Table 5.1. Amongst Industries 'Manufacture of Textiles' (Industry Code 13) ranked first with 703 injuries (both fatal & non-fatal), as it accounted for 18.00 per cent of the total number of injuries.

6.5 The Frequency Rate of injuries (fatal and non-fatal combined together) per one lakh man days worked was the highest in the industry group 'Advertising and market research' (Industry Code 73) being 24.39. The Incidence Rate of injuries (fatal and non-fatal combined together) per 1000 workers employed was again the highest in the industry group 'Advertising and market research' (Industry Code 73) being 38.46.

6.6 Among the States/Union Territories, Gujarat reported the highest i.e. 1412 injuries (fatal and non-fatal), which constituted 36.15 per cent of the total number of injuries. Of the total injuries during the year 2016, 19.89 per cent were fatal and rest was non-fatal injuries. The number of accidents in respect of women workers was negligible in comparison to the men workers.

6.7 Cause-wise number of injuries for the year 2016 by States and Industries have been presented in Tables 5.4 and 5.5. Among all the different causes, a cause 'Others' which includes Molten metal & Other hot or corrosive substances, Machinery not moved by mechanical power, Use of hand tools, Struck by falling body, Persons falling, Stepping on/ striking against the objects and Handling goods/ articles etc. (cause codes 121 to 131) accounted for majority of injuries i.e. 2462 which is 65.24 per cent of the total number of injuries reported under 'causes' during the year 2016.

6.8 The average number of man days lost due to non-fatal injuries, frequency rate and severity rate of non-fatal injuries in which workers returned to work during the same year by States and Industries during 2016 have been shown in Table 5.6. The overall average number of mandays lost was 45.95. Among the States/Union Territories, it was reported to be highest in Chhattisgarh (324.66 mandays) and the lowest in Bihar (3.86 mandays).

6.9 The overall frequency rate of injuries where workers returned to work was 0.37 in the year 2016. It was the highest in Bihar i.e. 4.67 and among the industry groups it was the highest in the Industry group of 'Advertising and market research' (Industry Code 73) i.e. 36.59 in the year 2016.

6.10 The overall severity rate of non-fatal injuries was 17.11 in 2016. It was highest in Chhattisgarh (561.78) during 2016. Among the industry groups, it was highest in the industry group of 'Advertising and market research' (Industry Code 73) i.e. 3158.54 in the year 2016.

CHAPTER-7

SAFETY MEASURES

7.1 With the continuous increase in the use of machinery, the arrangements for ensuring safety in factories have assumed immense significance. The Factories Act, 1948 has provided for several measures to ensure safety of the workers. Some of these are: (i) Fencing of machines of all sorts is compulsory, (ii) No person is to be employed in any factory to lift, carry or move any load so heavy as to be likely to cause him injury, (iii) If it appears to the Inspector that any building or part of a building or any part of the ways, machinery or plant in a factory is in a condition that it is dangerous to human life or safety, he may serve on the Manager of the factory an order in writing specifying the measure which in his opinion should be adopted and requiring them to be carried out before a stipulated date.

The important measures taken by different Factory Inspectorates of the respective States /U.Ts. in this direction in the year 2016 are summarized below: -

7.2 ANDHRA PRADESH: The main object of the Department is to educate, advice and guide the managements in adhering to the statutory provisions of the Statute. Technical guidance is given by the Inspectorate to the factory managements for ensuring safe and healthy working conditions and for providing adequate welfare amenities to the workers. Generally prosecutions are launched only as a last resort against President Defaulter.

7.3 A & N: Satisfactory exhaust fans are used and natural ventilation is provided. Duct systems are provided near the dust producing places. Masks are provided to the workers to protect/ prevent inhalation of dust and exhaust appliances are also provided. Effective measures are provided in the open air to prevent such accumulation of fumes. No artificial humidification is required as the Factories are situated near the sea shore. There is no overcrowding. The prescribed space for every worker is provided as per the Act (i.e. 14.2 mtrs). Sufficient and suitable lighting arrangements are provided.

7.4 ASSAM: The Inspectorate of Factories has taken special care for implementation of the Safety provisions of the Factories Act, 1948 and rules framed there under during the year. The department organized 'National Safety Day' and 'Safety Week' in factories and Safety Training was imparted to the workers and Management which resulted in sharp decrease in number of industrial accidents. Necessary guidance and advice was given by the Inspectors on adoption of safety precautions such as guarding of machinery, safe working conditions, careful handling of materials, use of personal protective devices etc. Major accident prone factories of Assam were asked to formulate their safety policies and to submit the policies. Most of the factories particularly the hazardous factories have constituted safety committee in the factory. Mock drills at periodical intervals were also carried out in the major accident hazards factories. The major accident hazards factories in the state have submitted the ON SITE emergency plans. The management of these factories have also been asked to prepare and submit the OFF SITE emergency

plans and disclosure of information as required under the provision of section 41-B of the Act.

7.5 BIHAR: To ensure the implementation of the safety measures the Chemical & Hazards Factories have been advised to make ON-SITE Emergency Plan and make Safety and Health Policy. The Inspector of Factories & Medical Inspector were advised to inspect factories from time to time.

7.6 CHANDIGARH: The factories, equipped with power-aided machines, generally violated the provisions relating to Safety measures (section-21). Sometimes even workers did not take proper care in replacing the guard on the machine after work and sometimes this negligence resulted into accidents of various nature. However, the Managements have been cautioned to take suitable measures to avoid industrial accidents. The safety measures regarding protection from dangerous fumes and dust (section 35 and 36) are stipulated under the Factories Act, 1948. In cases where units which were involved in operation such as emission of dangerous fume and dust etc., exhaust fans were provided while in other units precautions were taken to remove dust and fumes. Workers were issued safety goggles and other protection equipments. Managements are prosecuted if offences are reported. No violation was detected regarding employment of young person on dangerous machines (section -23).

7.7 HARYANA: The Inspectorate Staff ensures the implementation of the safety measures. Violations of these provisions were found generally in units which were equipped with old machines. Sometimes workers did work without safety gadgets as a result of which accidents of serious nature have taken place. The State Industrial Safety Directorate is also conducting various training programmes for the Supervisors to educate, advice and train them for maintaining safety system at work place (Section 21). The certifying Surgeons of the department continued to visit units regularly to medically examine the workers employed in dangerous operations as per schedule laid down in rule 72 of the Punjab Factories Rules, 1952 (Section 87). In some units which were involved in operations such as emission of dangerous fumes and dust etc., exhaust fans were provided while in other units, personal protective equipments were also provided to the workers for full protection. It was generally found that the workers did not wear protective equipment and goggles. According to the policy of the department, managements were prosecuted only if offences were repeated after warning (Section 36 & 37). The Directorate staff continued to take persuasive and legal steps for enforcing the use of desired equipments. Prosecutions for violations of the safety measures laid down in Section 22, 24 to 26, 28 to 35 and 38 were launched in 2084 cases during 2016. No violation was detected regarding employment of young persons on dangerous machines under section 23 and 27.

7.8 JHARKHAND: The inspectorate paid great attention to the field of accident prevention. All major factories were encouraged to seek the Co-operation of workers by introducing training programmer, seminars, exhibitions, lectures, meeting, film show, poster and slogans competition etc.

7.9 ODISHA: The Directorate has ensured conduct of Safety Training Program, Seminar, Safety promotion activities through visual aids and films by the managements of various factories at various locations of the state keeping in mind the concept of "Prevention is better than Cure". Besides Safety Day, Fire Safety Day and Chemical Prevention Day have been celebrated in the state.

7.10 TAMIL NADU: Apart from regular enforcement of Factories Act 1948 and allied Acts, operational safety of the pressure vessels installed in the Factories is also ensured by the department by conducting external, internal and Ultrasonic Thickness examination and by Hydrostatics test.

7.11 TELANGANA: Across the State, there were 47 factories wherein one thousand or more workers were ordinarily employed & notified for appointment of safety Officers. There were 82 factories which have appointed Safety Officer as required under Section 40-B. (82) Safety Officers were appointed in these factories.

7.12 TRIPURA: The compliance regarding safety measures was found to be satisfactory except in cases of "Fencing of Machinery" (Section 21) and protection in case of fire (section-38) where prosecution was launched against violation. The arrangements were found to be satisfactory in "Striking Gear and device for Cutting Power" (Section 24) except for new factories for which remedial measures had been instructed. In Pressure Plant (Section 31) many mini boilers (outside the purview of Indian Boilers Act) were put in use in many factories for supply of steam above normal atmospheric pressure. Safety valve tests were carried out to ensure safety in the operation. State rules are in force regarding "Carriage of excess weight (Section 34), limiting the maximum weight to be carried by workers. Only In one factory belonging to State Govt. Undertaking, the prescribed number of workers required for an appointment of one Safety Officer, but Safety Officer has not been appointed. In respect of site appraisal by the Site Appraisal Committee, it was not found satisfactory particularly for factories belonging to Govt. Compliance of provisions under hazardous processes (section 41-A to 41-H) in respect of factories under Private Sector and Public Sector is more or less satisfactory.

CHAPTER-8

HEALTH

8.1 Information available in the Annual Administrative Reports 2016 of various State Governments and Union Territories on health provisions for factory workers is discussed in the following paragraphs:

8.2 A. & N. Islands: Cleanliness in almost all the factories was satisfactory. Sawdust, end cut of the logs; barks are the only wastes in the Saw Mills. Sufficient wholesome drinking water has been provided which is approved by the Health Officer of the Health Department from the source of supply. Separate Latrine and Urinal accommodations have been provided for Men & Women and are maintained properly. Spittoons have been provided in all the factories by providing sand in wooden boxes.

8.3 ASSAM: The environmental factors such as presence of contaminants in the air, physical factors like humidity, noise, lighting etc. are examined by the Inspector and preventive measures are suggested. The Industrial Hygiene Laboratory had been revived with new equipments. The laboratory staff was entrusted with the job of testing sound level, environmental monitoring and toxic gas detection.

8.4 BIHAR: The Medical Inspector and Inspector of Factories are advised to inspect the factories from time to time to identify the effect of work environment on the health of workers.

8.5 CHANDIGARH: All the provisions of the Factories Act covering Health and Sanitation i.e. Cleanliness, Ventilation & Temperature, Disposal of Waste & Effluents, Dust & Fumes, Artificial Humidification, Lighting, Over Crowding, Drinking Water Facilities etc were found to be implemented satisfactorily. In small factories also the standard of cleanliness was satisfactory as the management-staff of these factories is educated and well trained.

8.6 HARYANA: Due to lack of proper attention given by the managements of small factories, the standard of general cleanliness was not satisfactory. However, in the big industrial units, the conditions were quite satisfactory. Some of the factories have made their own arrangements for disposal of trade-waste and effluents. Those managements who were found lacking had been asked to obtain no objection certificate from the Pollution Control Board. The arrangements of exhaust system in the units where dry mixing, pesticides formulating and other operations involving emission of dust, fumes and smokes from various liquids and gases were carried out were satisfactory. The arrangements of exhaust fans and chimneys were made wherever required. The need for humidification is generally felt in the textile industry dealing in cotton, yarn, staple yarn and cloth making industry. In some of the textile units, the Hygrometers were not properly maintained. The other provisions covering health & sanitation i.e. Ventilation & Temperature, Lighting, Overcrowding, Drinking Water, Latrine & Urinals and Spittoons were found to be implemented satisfactorily.

8.7 ODISHA: Health check up of 160439 workers working in the hazardous factories has been medically examined during 2016. Work environmental monitoring in respect of toxic gas, dust and noise have been conducted in many factories during the year.

8.8 TAMIL NADU: The Medical wing functioning in this department with one Chief Medical Officer and eight Medical officers conduct health surveys at periodical intervals for the workers employed in Chemical Factories and suggests both clinical and other preventive measures for them. They also conduct medical examination for the workers engaged in canteen periodically.

8.9 TRIPURA: On the whole, various provisions of the Act covering Health and Sanitation i.e. Cleanliness (Section-11), Disposal of Waste and Effluents (Section-12), Ventilation & Temperature (Section-13), Dust & Fumes (Section-14), Artificial humidification (Section-15), Overcrowding (Section-16), Lighting (Section-17), Drinking Water Facilities (Section-18), Latrines and Urinals (Section-19), & Spittoons (Section-20) were found to be implemented satisfactorily in the factories except in a few factories where inadequate ventilation and improper Dust and Fumes were reported. The position has, however improved after interference of the Investigating Officer.

CHAPTER-9

WELFARE

9.1 In order to ensure the welfare of workers, appropriate provisions have been made under Section 42 to 50 of the Factories Act, 1948. Under Section 45, ambulance room is to be provided in the factory wherein more than 500 workers are ordinarily employed. Under Section 46, State Governments are empowered to frame Rules requiring that in every factory, wherein more than two hundred fifty workers are ordinarily employed, a canteen shall be maintained by the occupier for the use of workers. Similarly, Section 47 envisages that every factory, wherein more than one hundred fifty workers are ordinarily employed, adequate and suitable shelters or rest rooms and lunch rooms with the provision of drinking water, where workers can take meals, should be provided and maintained for the use of workers. Section 48 provides that every factory, wherein more than thirty women are ordinarily employed, should provide and maintain a suitable room/Creche for the use of children below the age of six years of such women workers. Section 49 provides that the occupier of the factories employing 500 or more workers should appoint such number of welfare officers as may be prescribed under the Act to help the management in proper implementation of labour laws. The information relating to Safety Officers, Ambulance Room, Canteens, Creches, Shelters, Lunch Rooms and Welfare officers by States/U.Ts. and Industries for the year 2016 has been presented in Table 8.1 and 8.2. Majority of the factories in all the States / U.Ts. even though all of them were not statutorily required to provide Canteen, Creche and Shelter or Rest Rooms etc., provided these facilities.

Information regarding various welfare facilities as furnished by different States and Union Territories in their reports for the year 2016 on the working of the Factories Act, 1948 is furnished in the following paragraphs:

9.2 **ANDHRA PRADESH:** Of the total factories required to provide canteen facility under Section 46 of the Factories Act, 88.65 per cent factories provided this facility to their workers. Similarly, under Section 47 of the Factories Act, 418 factories have provided shelters, rest rooms and lunch rooms, whereas 443 factories were required to provide these facilities. 84.15 per cent Factories have provided Creches out of the total number of factories employing more than 30 women workers and required to provide Creches under section 48. 151 Welfare Officers were appointed in the factories as required under Section 49.

9.3 **ASSAM:** The welfare amenities like canteen, shelters/ rest rooms and Creches etc. were provided by sufficient number of the factories as a statutory requirement. These amenities are also provided by some managements in their establishment/ factories though they are not statutory bounded to do so. The average daily number of workers utilizing these facilities is highly satisfactory.

9.4 **BIHAR:** All the factories coming under the ambit of providing canteens as required under Section 46 complied by the statute. More numbers of factories than required as per the Act have provided Ambulance Room and Shelters/Rest Rooms.

9.5 CHANDIGARH: It had been observed that some factories did not provide adequate facilities for storing, washing and drying of clothing etc. The Inspectorate Staff continued to take persuasive and legal steps to implement the provisions. These facilities were specially checked by the Additional Chief Inspector of Factories as per provisions of the Factories Act to avoid difficulty later on. The management had generally provided first aid boxes. As required under section 46 of the Factories Act, 3 factories have provided canteens for their workers run by the occupier and 3 factories provided canteens to their workers run by the contractors. The implementation of the provisions regarding Shelter & Rest room (Section 47) was found to be quite satisfactory as 47 factories were providing facilities of shelter and rest rooms to their workers. No factory had provided the Creche facility. The provisions regarding weekly holidays, compensatory holidays, hours of work and rest intervals etc were satisfactorily implemented.

9.6 HARYANA: Adequate facilities for storing, washing and drying of clothing etc. were not provided by some factories. The Inspectorate Staff continued to take persuasive and legal steps to implement these provisions, which were to be made in the beginning when factory building plans are submitted to the Chief Inspector of Factories for approval. Various welfare provisions such as First Aid Appliances, Canteens, Shelter, Rest Rooms and Lunch Rooms and Creches etc. have been implemented satisfactorily. It is commendable that when it comes to the canteens, shelters, rest rooms and lunch rooms, the number of factories which are providing these amenities is greater than the number which is required to provide these amenities as per the purview of the Act. It is worthwhile to mention here that managements of many small units are also providing two times tea free of cost. 134 factories have appointed 151 Welfare Officers in the state.

9.7 ODISHA: The welfare amenities like canteen, shelters/ rest rooms are provided by all the factories which are required to do so. All the factories required to provide Creches has been instructed to comply with the requirements of Section 48 of the Factories Act, 1948 and rules made there under. The concerned Asst. Director of Factories and Boilers has been asked to ensure compliance.

9.8 TRIPURA: Over all compliance in implementing various welfare provisions was satisfactory. All factories have provided Shelters/Rest rooms wherein more than 150 workers were ordinarily employed. Similarly, all factories except one/two have provided Creches facility employing 30 or more women which are bound to do so. Compliance of providing First aid appliances under section 45 is also satisfactory.

CHAPTER 10

INSPECTIONS AND CONVICTIONS

- 10.1 Convention No. 81 (Article 22) of the International Labour Organisation required that information relating to the number of Inspectorate Staff under the Factories Act, 1948 may be collected. Such information for the year 2016 relating to various States/Union Territories has been shown in Table 9.2.
- 10.2 The Factory Inspectorates in various States/Union Territories inspect the factories to ensure that there is no infringement of the provisions of the Factories Act, 1948. Table 9.1 gives information relating to number of factories inspected during the year 2016. Out of 66300 factories inspected, 75.17 per cent factories were inspected only once in the year 2016.
- 10.3 The Inspectorate Staff inquired into complaints lodged by individual workers, trade unions, private persons, etc., regarding infringement of the provisions of the Factories Act, 1948 and took suitable action, wherever necessary.
- 10.4 The number of convictions obtained against the factory management for infringement of various provisions of the Factories Act, 1948 from various States/Union Territories during 2016 is given in Table 9.3. The maximum number of factories i.e. 5043 involved in such convictions was reported by Tamil Nadu followed by Chhattisgarh where 381 factories were involved in convictions. Out of the total 9203 convictions, 1922 convictions i.e. 20.88 per cent pertained to the offences relating to Safety Provisions.
