The Rural Labour Enquiry which throws light on various facets of Rural Labour Households has been conducted since 1963-65. The enquiry was however integrated with the National Sample Survey in 1977-78 and since then the enquiry is being undertaken quinquennially on regular basis along with the General Employment & Unemployment and the Household Consumer Expenditure Surveys of the National Sample Survey Office (NSSO). The latest enquiry was conducted during 66th round (2009-10) of the NSS. The main objective of the Enquiry is to provide up-to-date serial data on socio-economic condition of the Rural Labour Households to the policy makers for formulating polices and also to the researchers for making research. With this objective in view, the data collected under each of the quinquennial surveys conducted by the NSSO is processed and analysed by the Labour Bureau and five different Reports viz., (i) General Characteristics of Rural Labour Households; (ii) Consumption Expenditure; (iii) Wages & Earnings; (iv) Indebtedness; and (v) Employment & Unemployment of Rural Labour Households are brought out.

The present report on Consumption Expenditure of Rural Labour Households is second in the series of five reports and intends to analyze the monthly/annual consumption expenditure of rural labour households vis-à-vis agricultural labour households, its distribution in terms of different item groups, size of household by sex and age for each decile class of monthly per capita expenditure etc. I am confident that this report will be very useful to all the policy makers/ researchers.

I convey my sincere thanks to Field Operation Division (FOD), Survey Design and Research Division (SDRD) and Data Processing Division (DPD) of National Sample Survey Office (NSSO) for collecting, tabulating and supplying the data to Labour Bureau. I also convey my thanks to the officials of Rural Labour Enquiry Division of Labour Bureau [Annexure – IV] for their sincere efforts in preparing this report in timely manner.

I look forward to your kind suggestions/comments to enrich this report further.

RURAL LABOUR ENQUIRY REPORT ON CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE OF RURAL LABOUR HOUSEHOLDS (2009 – 10)

SUMMARY

Labour Bureau has been bringing out five reports viz., i) General Characteristics of Rural Labour Households; ii) Wages and Earnings of Rural Labour Households; iii) Indebtedness among Rural Labour Households; iv) Employment and Unemployment of Rural Labour Households; and v) Consumption Expenditure of Rural Labour Households under the Rural Labour Enquiry.

The present **Rural Labour Enquiries Reports** brought out by the Labour Bureau are based on the data collected by the National Sample Survey Office in its 66th Round Survey (July, 2009 to June, 2010). The report on the Consumption Expenditure of Rural Labour Households reflects the level consumption expenditure, its pattern and distribution among rural labour households vis-à-vis Agricultural Labour Households.

The gist of the findings of report on 'Consumption Expenditure of Rural Labour Households (2009-10)', which is 2nd in the series of five reports, is outlined below.

There were 65.7/41.7 million rural/agricultural labour households constituting 40.4%/25.6% of the total estimated rural households (162.8 million) in the country. A significant proportion of the rural labour households belonged to the weaker classes i.e. the scheduled castes (32.4%), the scheduled tribes (12.5%) and other backward classes (39.0%).

The report reveals that at all-India level, average monthly per capita expenditure (MPCE) in 2009-10 was estimated at Rs.767.79 for Rural Labour Households and Rs.719.04 for Agricultural Labour Households. The report further reveals that there was an inverse relationship between the MPCE and the size of household. The average household size of Rural Labour Household was 5.58 for the lowest decile class of MPCE as compared to 3.27 for the highest decile class of MPCE. This difference was attributed mainly by the composition of households with preponderance of children (below 15 years) in the poorer households. The average number of children in Rural Labour Households was 2.37 in the lowest decile class of MPCE as compared to 0.62 in the highest decile class of MPCE.

The dependency ratio (i.e. children per adult member of household) is observed to decline with the increase in MPCE. The dependency ratio of Rural Labour Households at the bottom or lowest decile class of MPCE was 0.74 which steadily goes on declining over higher decile class of MPCE and was 0.23 at the highest decile class of MPCE. Similar trend is observed in respect of ALHs which was 0.70 for the lowest decile class of MPCE and 0.24 for the highest decile class of MPCE.

At all India level, the average annual expenditure of Rural Labour Households was Rs.41,850 in 2009-10 which was higher by 67.19% over 2004-05 estimates of Rs.25,032. The state of Nagaland was on the top with

Rs.89,454 whereas Odisha was at the bottom with Rs.29,545 as average annual expenditure. In 12 States/Union Territories (Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Tripura Orissa and Chandigarh), the annual consumption expenditure per Rural Labour Households was below the all-India average while in remaining other 24 States/Union Territories it was above the all-India average.

The distribution of annual consumption expenditure on different item groups of consumption reveals that expenditure on food items constituted the major proportion of the total expenditure of Rural Labour Households. During the year 2009-10 the proportion of expenditure on food however, declined to 56.2% as compared to 57.7% in 2004-05. The decline was also reflected in Fuel & Light and Stimulants & Intoxicants groups. Contrary to this, the Clothing, Bedding & Footwear and Miscellaneous & Services groups showed an upward trend at All-India level during the survey period. The expenditure on House Rent however showed no fluctuation and remained stationary at the previous level of 0.4 percent. Though the preponderance of food group item in total consumption expenditure of Rural Labour Households was pervasive in all the states, at the same time they reflected enough variability among them and differed from state to state. It is also observed that in less developed states/UTs the food items accounted for higher proportion than the all-India average of 56.2%. Similar trend was also reflected in the case of Agricultural Labour Households.

Within 'food' group cereal items accounted for major proportion of the consumption expenditure (31%). Percentage share of cereal items in total expenditure on food items of Rural Labour Households declined from 37% in 2004-05 to 31% in 2009-10. Besides cereals, the percentage expenditure on Oils & Fats and Condiments & Spices also showed declining trend during this period. With the gradual and steady decline over a period of time in the percentage share of total expenditure on cereals among the food items, it reflects a major shift in consumption pattern of Rural Labour Households towards non cereal items such as Milk & Milk Products, Pulses & Pulses Products, Vegetables & Fruits, Meat, Fish & Eggs and Other Food items.

An analysis of the pattern of consumption expenditure based on the data presented for the last 35 years (i.e. 1974-75 to 2009-10) has also exhibited a secular downward trend in the share of food items as well as cereal items in the total expenditure of Rural Labour Households. The share of food which was 78.4% in 1974-75 had steadily declined in the subsequent enquiries and reached to the level of 56.2% in 2009-10. Similarly, expenditure on cereals as percentage to total expenditure which was 54.1% during 1974-75 has also shown a similar secular down ward trend to reach the level of 17.4% in 2009-10. At most a similar trend was observed in respect of agricultural labour households also.

Note: It may be noted that for collection of information on occupation of the workers and the principal household occupation, 3-digit code of NCO-2004 was used in NSS 66th round as against NCO-1968 used in earlier rounds. Hence the results may not be strictly comparable as the concordance between 3-digit code of NCO-2004 and NCO-1968 was not possible.

CHAPTER - I

SCOPE AND METHOD OF ENQUIRY

1. Introduction

- 1.1 In India about two-third of the total labour force lives in the rural areas. Wage paid employment being the main source of their livelihood it has always been the main thrust of the Government of India to alleviate poverty, especially in the rural areas, by formulating and implementing various target result oriented poverty alleviation and development programmes. It was however felt that for formulating suitable and appropriate policies and action programmes, as well as for reviewing such policies/ programmes, the availability of sound data base is extremely important. Recognising the need for sound data base, the Government of India conducted first Agricultural Labour Enquiry (ALE) in the year 1950-51, followed by the second Enquiry in the year 1956-57. The scope of the subsequent enquiries was however widened and enlarged with intent to cover all rural labour households, instead of restricting these to agricultural labour households alone covered in the first two enquiries. Hence, the third enquiry in the series with the changed nomenclature, namely, the 'First Rural Labour Enquiry (RLE)' was conducted in the year 1963-65 followed by the second in 1974-75, the third in 1977-78, the fourth in 1983, the fifth in 1987-88, the sixth in 1993-94, the seventh in 1999-2000 and the eighth in 2004-05. The latest enquiry, which is ninth in the series, was conducted during 66th round (2009-10) of the NSS (National Sample Survey). With a view to narrow down the gap between the successive rounds of the Enquiries, the RLE was integrated with the General Employment & Unemployment Survey of the NSSO in the year 1977-78. All subsequent enquiries are now being conducted quinquennially to provide distinct and continuous data in the form of a time series on various parameters.
- 1.2 During the course of the Rural Labour Enquiries, data on various socio-economic facets viz, Employment & Unemployment; Consumption Expenditure; Wages & Earnings; and Indebtedness of rural and agricultural labourer households are collected. The job of collection of data for the earmarked survey was entrusted to the Field Operation Division (FOD) of the National Sample Survey Office (NSSO) through its network of zonal, regional and sub-regional offices located all over the Country. Under these enquiries, data are collected and analysed for rural labour as a whole. However, in order to have comparison with the previous rounds of enquiries and also to understand problems of this segment of labour force, which constitutes significant proportion of the rural labour, the analysis for agricultural labour are however, presented separately. The Labour Bureau is responsible for processing and dissemination of data, collected under RLE. The results of the latest Rural Labour Enquiry, the ninth in the series, for which the field work was undertaken by the NSSO (FOD) during its 66th Round Survey (July, 2009 to June, 2010), are being published in the form of the following five reports
 - i) General Characteristics of Rural Labour Households;
 - ii) Consumption Expenditure of Rural Labour Households;
 - iii) Indebtedness among Rural Labour Households;
 - iv) Wages and Earnings of Rural Labour Households; and
 - v) Employment and Unemployment of Rural Labour Households.

The usefulness of the data thrown up by the various Rural Labour Enquiries has been acknowledged by various Committees and Commissions constituted by the government from time to time. The National Commission on Labour (1969) and the National Commission on Rural Labour (1991) have recommended that the periodic surveys undertaken by the Government to understand the rural situation should be continued and intensified. The second National Commission on Labour (1999) has also recommended that the Rural Labour Enquiries should be conducted more frequently.

2. Objectives

2.1 The main objectives of the enquiry are:

- i) To provide up-to-date serial data on demographic structure, extent and status of employment & unemployment, wages and earnings, household consumption expenditure, indebtedness, etc. for building up of reliable estimates of important socio-economic characteristics of rural labour in general and agricultural labour in particular.
- ii) To provide data relating to consumption expenditure for derivation of weighting diagrams for updating the series of CPI numbers for agricultural and rural labourers.

3. Scope

The Rural Labour Enquiry relates to all rural labour households. However, provision has been made in the tabulation plan to get separate estimates for agricultural labour households and rural labour households.

4. Geographical Coverage

The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union except (i) interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond five kilometres of the bus route and (ii) villages in Andaman and Nicobar Islands which remained inaccessible throughout the year. However, all the sample first stage units of both rural and urban areas of Leh, Kargil and Poonch districts of Jammu & Kashmir became casualty and therefore these districts were outside the survey coverage.

5. Concepts and Definitions

The important concepts and definitions adopted for the survey are as follows:-

(i) Household

A group of persons who normally live together and take food from a common kitchen constitute a household. The adverb "normally" means that temporary visitors and guests (whose total period of stay in the household is expected to be less than 6 months) are excluded but temporary stay-aways (whose total period of absence from the household is expected to be less than 6 months) are included. Thus a child residing in a hostel for studies is excluded from the household of his/her parents, but a resident domestic servant or paying guest (but not just a tenant in the house) is included in the employer's/host's household. "Living together" is given more importance than "sharing food from a common kitchen" in drawing the boundaries of a household in case the two criteria are in conflict. However, in the special case of a person taking food with his family but sleeping elsewhere (say, in a shop or a different house) due to

shortage of space, the household formed by such a person's family members is taken to include the person also. Each inmate of a hotel, mess, boarding-lodging house, hostel, etc., is considered to be a single-member household except that a family living in a hotel (say) is considered one household only. The same principle is applicable for the residential staff of such establishments. The size of a household is the total number of persons in the household.

(ii) Rural Labour Household

A household is classified as a rural labour household if its major source of income during the last 365 days preceding the survey is more from wage paid manual labour (agricultural and/or non-agricultural) than either from paid non-manual employment or from self-employment. Rural labour households include agricultural labour households as well.

(iii) Agricultural Labour Household

Of the households which are initially classified as 'Rural Labour Households', those deriving 50 percent or more of their total income from wage paid manual labour in agricultural activities are treated as agricultural labour households.

(iv) Rural Labour Households with Cultivated Land

A household having cultivated land, either 'owned', 'land leased-in' or 'land neither owned nor leased-in', is treated as household with cultivated land. Land cultivated (including orchard and plantation) during the agricultural year 2008-2009, i.e., July 2008 to June 2009 was recorded. Cultivated land is taken to mean the net area sown during the last calendar year (i.e. July to June) preceding the year of enquiry and included orchards and current fallows. Area with field crops and area under orchards and plantations is counted only once in the same year/ season.

(v) Land Possessed

The area of land possessed includes land 'owned', 'leased in' and 'land neither owned nor leased in' (i.e. encroached) by the household but excluded land 'leased out'. In collecting information regarding land possessed, the actual position as obtained on the date of survey is considered. The 'area of land possessed' does not include the area of land owned, leased-in, etc. by the servants/paying guests who are considered as normal members of the household, as per the definition of household taken up for the survey.

(vi) Manual Work

A job essentially involving physical labour is considered manual work. However, jobs essentially involving physical labour but also requiring a certain level of general, professional, scientific or technical education are not termed as 'manual work'. On the other hand, jobs not involving much of physical labour and at the same time not requiring much educational (general, scientific, technical or otherwise) background are treated as 'manual work'. Thus, engineers, doctors, dentists, midwives, etc., are not considered manual workers even though their jobs involved some amount of physical labour. But, peons, chowkidars, watchman, etc. are considered manual workers even though their work might not involve much physical labour. A few examples of manual workers are cooks, waiters, building caretakers, sweepers, cleaners and related workers, launderers, dry cleaners and pressers, hair dressers, barbers, beauticians, watchmen, gate keepers, agricultural labourers, plantation labourers and related workers.

(vii) Wage Paid Manual Labour

A person who does manual work in return for wages in cash or kind or partly in cash and partly in kind (excluding exchange labour) is considered as a wage paid manual labour. Salaries are also considered as wages. A person who is self-employed in manual work is not treated as a wage paid manual labour.

(viii) Rural Labour

Manual labour working in agricultural and /or non-agricultural occupations in return for wages paid either in cash or in kind (excluding exchange labour) and living in rural areas, is taken as rural labour.

(ix) Agricultural Labour

A person is considered as agricultural labour, in case he/she follows one or more of the following agricultural occupations in the capacity of a wage paid manual labour, whether paid in cash or kind or both:

- a) farming,
- b) dairy farming,
- c) production of any horticultural commodity,
- d) raising of livestock, bees or poultry,
- e) any practice performed on a farm as incidental to or in conjunction with farm operations (including forestry and timbering) and the preparation for market and delivery to storage or to market or to carriage for transportation to market of farm produce.

Working in fisheries is excluded from agricultural labour. Further, 'carriage for transportation' refers only to the first stage of transport action i.e. from farm to the first place of disposal.

(x) Wage and Salary Earnings

Information on wage and salary earnings are collected separately for each of the wage/salaried work recorded for a person in a day. Here, earnings refer to the wage/salary income (and not total earnings taking into consideration of all other activities done) received/receivable for the wage/salaried work done during the reference week by a wage/salaried employee and casual labourer. The wage/ salary received or receivable may be in cash or kind or partly in cash and partly in kind. While recording the earnings following conventions are followed.

- a) The wages in kind are evaluated at the current retail price.
- b) Bonus and perquisites such as free accommodation, reimbursement of expenditure for medical treatment, free telephones, etc. evaluated at the cost of the employer or at retail prices and duly apportioned for the reference week are also included in earnings.

c) Amount receivable as 'over-time' for the additional work done beyond normal working time is excluded.

It may be noted that in the survey, at most two activities are recorded for a person in a day. Therefore, it is possible that a person might have carried out two or more wage/salaried activities in a day, but either one activity or two activities at the most, depending upon the time spent on those activities, are recorded. In such cases, the wage/salary income only from recorded activity(ies) is collected and recorded separately, and not the total income of the person from all the activities done during the entire day.

(xi) Economic Activity

The entire spectrum of human activity falls into two categories – economic activities and non-economic activities. Any activity resulting in production of goods and services that add value to national product is considered as an economic activity for the employment and unemployment survey. Such activities include production of all goods and services for market (i.e. for pay or profit) including those of government services, and, the production of primary commodities for own consumption and own account production of fixed assets.

(xii) Usual Occupation

The usual occupation of a person is the economic activity which he may be pursuing during the major part of the 365 days preceding the date of the survey.

(xiii) Activity Status

It is the activity situation in which a person is found participating in economic and non-economic activities during the reference period. According to this, a person could be in one or a combination of the following three broad activity statuses during a reference period:

- a) working or being engaged in economic activity (work) as defined above,
- b) being not engaged in economic activity (work) but either making tangible efforts to seek 'work' or being available for 'work' if 'work' is available and
- c) being not engaged in any economic activity (work) and also not available for 'work'.

Broad activity statuses mentioned in (a) and (b) above are associated with 'being in labour force' and the last with 'not being in the labour force'. Within the labour force, broad activity status (a) and (b) are associated with 'employment' and 'unemployment', respectively.

(xiv) Workers (or Employed)

Persons who are engaged in any economic activity or who, despite their attachment to economic activity, abstain themselves from work for reason of illness, injury or other physical disability, bad weather, festivals, social or religious functions or other contingencies necessitating temporary absence from work, constitute workers. Unpaid helpers who assist in the operation of an economic activity in the household farm or non-farm activities are also considered as workers.

(xv) Seeking or Available for Work (or Unemployed)

Persons who, owing to lack of work, are not working but either seek work through employment exchanges, intermediaries, friends or relatives or by making applications to prospective employers or expressed their willingness or availability for work under the prevailing conditions of work and remuneration, are considered as those 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed).

(xvi) Labour Force

Persons who are either 'working' (or employed) or 'seeking or available for work' (or unemployed) constitute the labour force. Persons who are neither 'working' nor 'seeking or available for work' for various reasons during the reference period were considered as 'not in labour force'. Persons under this category are students, those engaged in domestic duties, rentiers, pensioners, recipients of remittances, those living on alms, infirm or disabled persons, too young persons, prostitutes, etc. and casual labourers not working due to sickness.

(xvii) Self-Employed

Persons who operate their own farm or non-farm enterprises or are engaged independently in a profession or trade on own-account or with one or a few partners are treated as self-employed in household enterprises. The essential feature of the self-employed is that they have autonomy (decide how, where and when to produce) and economic independence (in respect of choice of market, scale of operation and finance) for carrying out their operation. The remuneration of the self-employed consists of a non-separable combination of two parts: a reward for their labour and profit of their enterprise. The combined remuneration is wholly determined by the revenue from sales after netting out value of purchased inputs used in production. Self-employed persons are further categorised as follows:

- a) Own-account workers: those self-employed persons who operate their enterprises on their own account or with one or a few partners and who, during the reference period, by and large, run their enterprise without hiring any labour. They could, however, have had unpaid helpers to assist them in the activity of the enterprise;
- b) **Employers:** those self-employed persons who work on their own account or with one or a few partners and, who, by and large, ran their enterprise by hiring labour; and
- c) Helpers in household enterprise: those self-employed persons (mostly family members) who are engaged in their household enterprises, working full or part time and do not receive any regular salary or wages in return for the work performed. They do not run the household enterprise on their own but assist the related person living in the same household in running the household enterprise.

(xviii) Regular Salaried/Wage Employees

These are persons who work in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and, in return, receive salary or wages on a regular basis (i.e. not on the basis of daily or periodic renewal of work contract). This category includes not only persons getting time wage but also persons receiving piece wage or salary and paid apprentices, both full time and part-time.

(xix) Casual Labour

A person casually engaged in other's farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non household) and getting in return wage according to the terms of the daily or periodic work contract is a 'casual wage labourer'. Depending on whether they are so employed in 'public works' sponsored by government agencies or local bodies or in other types of work, the casual workers are classified into two groups viz. casual labour in public works and casual workers in other types of work.

(xx) Children

Persons below 15 years of age are treated as children.

(xxi) Household Consumer Expenditure

The expenditure incurred by a household on domestic consumption during the reference period is the household's consumer expenditure. Expenditure incurred towards productive enterprises of households is excluded from household consumer expenditure. Also excluded are expenditure on purchase and construction of residential land and building, interest payments, insurance premium payments, payments of fines and penalties, and expenditure on gambling including lottery tickets. Money given as remittance, charity, gift, etc. is not consumer expenditure. However, self-consumed produce of own farm or other household enterprise is valued and included in household consumer expenditure. So are goods and services received as payment in kind or free from employer, such as accommodation and medical care, and travelling allowance excluding allowance for business trips.

For articles of food (including pan, tobacco and intoxicants) and fuel, household consumption is measured by the quantity of the article actually used by the household during the reference period, irrespective of the expenditure incurred on it. For articles of clothing and footwear, consumption by a household is considered to occur at the moment when the article is brought into maiden or first use by any household member. The consumption may be out of (a) purchases made in cash or credit during the reference period or earlier; (b) home-grown stock; (c) receipts in exchange of goods and services; (d) any other receipt like gift, charity, borrowing and (e) free collection. Home produce is evaluated at the ex farm or ex factory rate.

For evaluating household consumption of all other items, a different approach is followed: the expenditure made by the household during the reference period for the purchase or acquisition of goods and services, regardless of when the goods and services are used and by whom, is considered as household consumption. However, for a few items of expenditure such as rent, telephone charges, consumer taxes and railway season tickets, expenditure during the month is recorded as the amount that was last paid divided by the number of months to which the payment related.

It is pertinent to mention here that the consumer expenditure of a household on food items relates to the actual consumption by the members of the household and also by the guests during ceremonies or otherwise. Normally, transfers of food, fuel, clothing and footwear made by a household as charity, loan advance, etc. are not considered as consumption of that household, since consumption out of all transfer receipts of these items have to be included. However, meals prepared in a household and served to non-household members are an exception to this rule. Meals prepared in the household kitchen and provided to the employees and/or others would automatically get included in domestic consumption of employer (payer) household. There is a practical difficulty of estimating the quantities and values of individual items used for preparing the meals served to employees or others. Thus, to avoid double

counting, cooked meals received as perquisites from employer household or as gift or charity are not recorded in the recipient household. As a general principle, cooked meals purchased from the market for consumption of the members and for guests are also recorded in the purchaser household. This procedure of recording cooked meals served to others in the expenditure of the serving households leads to bias-free estimates of average per capita consumption as well as total consumer expenditure.

All goods and services received as payment in kind or perquisites are included in the consumption of the recipient household as goods and services received in exchange of services, except for meals received from other households' kitchens.

To simplify data collection, consumption of food processed in the home from one 'item' into another, such as milk converted into curd or butter, vegetables converted into pickles, and rice converted into liquor are recorded in the survey against the primary or ingredient item(s), such as milk, instead of the item in which form it is consumed (e.g. curd). For some item groups such as intoxicants, this procedure leads to an underestimation of consumption with a corresponding overestimation of the item groups of the major ingredients, such as cereals.

(xxii) Monthly Per Capita Expenditure (MPCE)

The NSS concept of MPCE is defined first at the household level (household monthly consumer expenditure ÷ household size). This measure serves as the indicator of the household's level of living. Next, each individual's MPCE is defined as the MPCE of the household to which the person (man, woman or child) belongs. This assigns to each person a number representing his or her level of living. The distribution of persons by their MPCE (i.e., their household MPCE) can then be built up, giving a picture of the population classified by economic level.

(xxiii) Deciles and Decile Classes of MPCE

The first decile of the distribution of MPCE over the population of any region or domain is the level of MPCE below which 10% of the population lie, the second decile, the level below which 20% of the population lie, and so on. Thus the population can be divided into 10 'decile classes of MPCE' as follows: those with MPCE below the 1st decile of the MPCE distribution (the bottom 10% of the population ranked by MPCE), from the 1st decile to the 2nd decile (the next 10%), from the 2nd decile to the 3rd decile (the next 10%), and so on. Averages of other variables of interest, computed separately for the 10 decile classes, help to portray the variation of such variables with variation in MPCE. In line with usual NSS practice, decile classes of MPCE are formed separately for the rural and the urban sector, both for India as a whole and for the States.

(xxiv) Uniform Reference Period MPCE

This is the measure of MPCE obtained by the NSS consumer expenditure survey (CES) when household consumer expenditure on each item is recorded for a reference period of 'last 30 days' (preceding the date of survey). This measure has been used in the present report.

(xxv) Major States

This refers to the 17 States of India which had a population of 20 million or more according to the Census of 2001. The States are: Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal. Together, these States accounted for nearly 94.7% of India's population in 2001.

6. Period of the Survey

The enquiry was integrated with the 66th Round of the N.S.S. during the period 1st July, 2009 to 30th June, 2010, which was divided into 4 sub-rounds each of three months duration.

7. Sampling Design and Sample Size

- 7.1 Outline of the sampling design: A stratified multi-stage design was adopted for the 66th round survey. The first stage units (FSU) were the 2001 census villages (Panchayat wards in case of Kerala) in the rural sector and Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks in the urban sector. The ultimate stage units (USU) were households in both the sectors. Hamlet-groups/sub-blocks constituted the intermediate stage whenever these were formed in the sample FSUs.
- 7.2 Sampling Frame for First Stage Units: For the rural sector, the list of 2001 census villages (Panchayat wards in case of Kerala) constituted the sampling frame. For the urban sector, the list of latest available Urban Frame Survey (UFS) blocks constituted the sampling frame.
- 7.3 Stratification: Within each district of a State/ UT, two basic strata were formed as follows: i) rural stratum comprising of all rural areas of the district and (ii) urban stratum comprising of all the urban areas of the district. However, within the urban areas of a district, if there were one or more towns with population 10 lakhs or more as per population census 2001, each of them formed a separate basic stratum and the remaining urban areas of the district were considered as another basic stratum.
- 7.4 Sub-stratification: There was no sub-stratification in the urban sector. However, to net adequate number of child workers, for all rural strata, each stratum was divided into 2 substrata as follows:

sub-stratum 1: all villages with proportion of child workers (p) >2P (where P is the average proportion of child workers for the state/ UT as per Census 2001) sub-stratum 2: remaining villages

- 7.5 Total sample size (FSUs): At the all-India level, a total number of 12784 FSUs were allocated for survey in the central sample. In addition, 24 State sample FSUs (16 for rural sector and 8 for urban sector) of Leh and Kargil districts of J & K were included in the central sample.
- 7.6 Allocation of total sample to States and UTs: The total number of sample FSUs was allocated to the States and UTs in proportion to population as per census 2001 subject to the availability of investigators and ensuring minimum sample allocation to each State/UT.
- 7.7 Allocation of State/UT level sample to rural and urban sectors: The State/ UT level sample size was allocated between two sectors in proportion to population as per census 2001 with double weightage to urban sector subject to the restriction that urban sample size for bigger states like Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, etc. did not exceed the rural sample size. A minimum of 16 FSUs (to the extent possible) was allocated to each state/ UT separately for rural and urban areas. Further the State level allocations for both rural and urban areas were adjusted marginally in a few cases to ensure that each stratum/ sub-stratum got a minimum allocation of 4 FSUs.
- 7.8 Allocation to strata: Within each sector of a State/ UT, the respective sample size was allocated to the different strata/ sub-strata in proportion to the population as per census 2001.

Allocations at stratum/ sub-stratum level were adjusted to multiples of 4 with a minimum sample size of 4 and equal number of samples was allocated among the four sub rounds.

7.9 Selection of FSUs: For the rural sector, from each stratum/ sub-stratum, required number of sample villages were selected by probability proportional to size with replacement (PPSWR), size being the population of the village as per Census 2001. For urban sector, from each stratum FSUs were selected by using Simple Random Sampling Without Replacement (SRSWOR). Both rural and urban samples were drawn in the form of two independent subsamples.

7.10 Selection of hamlet-groups/sub-blocks: Selected FSUs with approximate population 1200 or more were divided into a suitable number (say, D) of 'hamlet-groups' in the rural sector and 'sub-blocks' in the urban sector as stated below.

Hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks were formed in the sample FSU by more or less equalising populations. Two hamlet-groups (hg)/ sub-blocks (sb) were selected from a large FSU, wherever hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks were formed. This was done in the following manner – one hg/ sb with maximum percentage share of population was always selected and termed as hg/ sb 1; one more hg/ sb was selected from the remaining hg's/ sb's by simple random sampling (SRS) and termed as hg/ sb 2. Listing and selection of the households was done independently in the two selected hamlet-groups/ sub-blocks. The FSUs without hg/ sb formation were treated as sample hg/ sb number 1.

- **7.11 Sampling frame of households:** All households listed in a village/UFS block where no hamlet-group/sub-block formation was done, or the households listed in the two selected hamlet-groups/sub-blocks of the village/UFS block where hamlet-group/sub-block formation was done, constituted the sampling frame of households.
- **7.12 Stratification of rural households:** For Schedule 1.0 (Consumer Expenditure), all households listed in the selected FSU/hamlet group/sub-blocks were stratified into three second stage strata (SSS). The three second-stage-strata (SSS) formed in the rural areas were:

Identification of affluent households was done by taking into account factors generally associated with affluent households such as: ownership of motor car/ jeep/ tractor/ combine-harvester/ truck/ bus/ etc.; consumer durables like DVD/ VCP/ refrigerator/ washing machine etc.; ownership of large business/ highly remunerative profession/ high salaried income etc.; ownership of spacious pucca house in good condition; ownership of 7 hectares or more of cultivable land; ownership of 3.5 hectares or more of irrigated land; ownership of a good number of cattle, buffaloes and camels (10 or more in number).

- **7.13 Selection of households:** For each Schedule type, a total of 8 households were selected from each village/FSU. In both rural and urban areas, in case no hamlet-group/subblock formation was done in the village/block, a number of 2, 4 and 2 households were selected from the second stage strata SSS1, SSS2 and SSS3, respectively. In case hamlet-groups/sub-blocks were formed in the village/block, a number of 1, 2 and 1 households were selected respectively from the second stage strata SSS1, SSS2 and SSS3 of each of the hamlet-groups/sub-blocks. The sample households from each of the second stage strata were selected by SRSWOR.
- **7.14 Sample Size:** A total of 2,87,139 persons belonging to 59,119 households spread over 7,428 villages were surveyed at all-India level for canvassing Schedule 1.0 Schedule Type 1 (consumer expenditure survey). The number of sample villages, households and persons surveyed in different States/Union Territories and all-India for rural sector are set out in the Table-1.

9. Present Report

This is the second report in the series of five reports to be brought out on the basis of ninth RLE covering different aspect concerning rural labour. The report contains the basic results on household consumption expenditure over a period of time at state as well as at all-India level. It gives (a) monthly per capita consumption expenditure for each decile class of MPCE. (b) Information on number of adults and children by sex and sex ratio (c) break up of average annual consumption of RLHs and ALHs by different important groups of consumption (d) separate and segregated break-up of average annual per capita expenditure on food items for cereal and non cereal items (e) per capita consumption of cereals in terms of quantity. Accordingly, estimates are being presented separately for Rural Labour Households as well as for Agricultural Labour Households. A comparative picture of the main findings of nine Rural Labour Enquiries conducted till date on Consumption Expenditure for Rural Labour in India is also given in Annexure-I.

CHAPTER-II

HOUSEHOLD CHARACTERISTICS BY CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The magnitude and pattern of consumption expenditure data collected under the Rural Labour Enquiry assume great significance to the policy makers for making policies for the upliftment of the rural labours and also the researchers for evaluating the impact of various welfare programmes implemented by the government. Thus, the data, collected from time to time through this enquiry, therefore, serves to highlight certain aspects of levels of living of rural labour. As the consumption expenditure is influenced by the size and characteristics of the Households, to a large extent it is pertinent to examine the various characteristics of Rural/Agricultural Labour Households (RLH/ALH) vis-a-vis their consumption and expenditure behavior.
- 2.2 The expenditure incurred by a household on domestic consumption during the reference period (i.e. last 30 days preceding the date of enquiry) is taken as the consumption expenditure of a household. It is the total monetary values of consumption of various groups of items, classified as under:-
 - 1. Food
 - 2. Stimulants and intoxicants (pan, tobacco, intoxicants, etc.)
 - 3. Fuel & light
 - 4. Clothings, bedding & footwear
 - 5. House rent
 - 6. Miscellaneous goods and services and durable goods.
- 2.3 The Household Consumption Expenditure has been taken to mean the expenditure on consumption for domestic purposes only and any expenditure in connection with the productive enterprise of a household has not been taken into account. Similarly, expenditure of a capital nature, if any, has also not been considered and left out. Though the transfer payments like charity, gifts, loan advance, etc. made by the household have not been considered as household consumption expenditure, yet the consumption out of transfer receipts (gifts, charity and loans etc received) have duly been taken into account.
- 2.4. During the reference period the total consumption of a household may be from different sources as follows:-
 - (a) purchases made during the reference period or earlier;
 - (b) home grown stock;
 - (c) receipts in exchange of goods and services;
 - (d) any other receipt like gift, charity, borrowing; and
 - (e) free collection

Consumption out of purchase is evaluated at the purchase price. Consumption out of home produce is evaluated at ex-farm or ex-factory rate. Value of Consumption out of gifts, loans and free collection and goods received in exchange of goods and services is imputed at the rate of average local retail prices prevailing during the reference period.

AVERAGE MONTHLY PER CAPITA EXPENDITURE (MPCE)

- 2.5 The total expenditure incurred by a household over a period of 30 days divided by household size has been expressed as monthly per capita expenditure (MPCE) of a household. The MPCE is a very important indicator for determining a living standard of a household. To study the standard of living of Rural and Agricultural Labour Households, average monthly per capita expenditure for 10 decile classes of MPCE is presented in Statements 2.1(a) and 2.1(b) respectively. The first decile class comprises the bottom 10 percent of rural population in terms of MPCE and the top (10th) decile class comprises the top 10 percent of rural population. Further, in addition to all-India decile classes, similar State specific decile classes are also derived and State-wise results are given for these classes.
- 2.6 At all-India level, average MPCE in 2009-10 was estimated at Rs.767.79 for Rural Labour Households and Rs.719.04 for Agricultural Labour Households. For poorest 10% of India's rural population i.e. in 1st decile class of MPCE, RLHs and ALHs have an average MPCE of Rs.375.43 and Rs.373.92 respectively. For 10th decile class of MPCE in which top 10% of the rural population falls, RLHs and ALHs have an average MPCE of Rs.2285.72 and Rs.2164.91 respectively.
- 2.7 The state-wise analysis of MPCE and other related variables has been restricted to 17 major states of the country due to very small size of sample in other States/UTs. These major States are: Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal. These States taken together constitute about 95%, 97% and 99% of the estimated rural households, rural labour households and agricultural labour households respectively of the country in 2009-10. Hence, the connotation 'major States' occurring henceforth refers to this group of States.

Average MPCE of RLHs among major States revealed that Kerala (Rs.1443.28) has the highest MPCE followed by Punjab (Rs.1026.17) and Haryana (Rs.928.41). Average MPCE was lowest in Bihar (Rs.564.92) followed by Odisha (Rs.568.68) and Chhattisgarh (Rs.594.45). In other major States it was between Rs.596 and Rs.894.

Similarly, the average MPCE of ALHs indicates that Kerala (Rs.1187.24) has the highest MPCE followed by Punjab (Rs.987.58) and Rajasthan (Rs.862.64). Average MPCE was lowest in Odisha (Rs.537.08) followed by Bihar (Rs.563.37) and Chhattisgarh (Rs.579.40).

2.8 The distribution of MPCE among households shows that it is not very uneven. The Lorenz concentration ratio for distribution of households by different decile classes of MPCE for RLHs is 0.2649 as indicated in Table 2.1.



It may be seen in the table above that generally, the states with higher level of MPCE have higher concentration ratio and vice-versa. Out of 17 States, fifteen States have lower concentration ratio than the all-India CR. However, two States have higher CR than the all-India concentration ratio.

At all-India level, the average size of Rural Labour Households and Agricultural Labour Households was 4.48 (including 1.49 children) and 4.38 (including 1.42 children) during 2009-10 as compared to 4.60 and 4.54 respectively during 2004-05. As ranked by MPCE, the poorer households have much higher household size than the 'All Classes' average. It is also observed that there is an inverse relationship between the average MPCE by decile classs and the size of the households both for RLHs and ALHs. The coefficient of correlation was (-) 0.85 for RLHs and (-) 0.82 for ALHs. From this it can be construed that the households with a larger size have a lower standard of living and vice versa. Another interesting outcome of the Enquiry is that the dependency ratio (defined as number of children per adult member of the household) goes on declining among the households with higher per-capita expenditure. Dependency ratio of RLHs at the lowest decile class of MPCE was observed at 0.74 as compared to the dependency ratio of the highest decile class of MPCE at 0.23 as shown in Table 2.2. Similar trend is reflected in the case of ALHs also, which is at 0.70 for the lowest decile class and 0.24 for the highest decile class of MPCE.

- 2.10 The average number of persons in each of the decile class of MPCE for Rural Labour Households and Agricultural Labour Households have been presented in Statements 2.2(a) and 2.2(b) respectively.
- 2.11 Average household composition in terms of number of adults and children by sex in each of the decile class of MPCE is given in Statements 2.3 to 2.3.35 for Rural as well as Agricultural Labour Households for All-India and each State/Union Territory.
- 2.12 As depicted by Statement 2.2(a) and 2.2(b), for major States, the average household size of Rural Labour Household was the highest in Uttar Pradesh (5.23) followed by Bihar (5.18) and the lowest in Tamil Nadu (3.68) followed by Andhra Pradesh (3.79). Similarly for Agricultural Labour Household, the highest household size was in Uttar Pradesh (5.17) followed by Bihar (5.16) and the lowest in Tamil Nadu (3.57) followed by Andhra Pradesh (3.71).

Out of 17 major States, the average family size of Rural Labour Household in 9 States was above the national average, in 7 States it was below the national level and in one state it remained at par with the national level. However, in case of ALH, average family size in 10 States was above the all-India average and in remaining 7 States, it was below the national average.

Table 2.3 below shows the state wise dependency ratio of 17 major States for Rural labour Households during 2009-10.



2.13 The above table reveals that there is an inverse relationship between dependency ratio (DR) and MPCE of Rural Labour Households. The State of Kerala with highest MPCE is having a lowest dependency ratio of 0.31 whereas Bihar State with lowest MPCE has highest dependency ratio of 0.76. The relationship between the two has been depicted in the scatter diagram No. 2.

It reveals similar pattern in case of Agricultural Labour Households also.

2.15 It is observed from the above table that the average household size for Rural Labour Households is 5.58 for the lowest decile class of MPCE in comparison to 3.27 for the highest decile class. In the case of Agricultural Labour Household the corresponding size is 5.47 and 3.23 respectively for bottom and top decile class of MPCE. The difference is the result on account of the composition of households with preponderance of children (in the age group of less than 15 years) in the poorest households as is evident from the above mentioned table. The average number of persons under 15 years of age per Rural Labour Household is 2.37 in the lowest decile class of MPCE as compared to 0.62 in the highest decile class of MPCE. A similar trend has been observed in case of Agricultural Labour Households as the corresponding figure is 2.26 in the bottom decile class of MPCE while it is 0.62 in the highest decile class of MPCE.

CHAPTER III

PATTERN OF CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

3.1 In this chapter an attempt has been made to study the change in consumption pattern of Rural/Agricultural Labour Households over a period of time. Annual average consumption expenditure of a household has been estimated from the consumption expenditure on various items of consumption incurred by Rural and Agricultural Labour Households during the reference period of the survey. To study the behavioural change in the pattern of consumption of these rural households, annual estimates of consumption are presented in Statements 3.1 – 3.1.35 which depict average annual consumption expenditure on item groups of consumption and the share of each group as percentage to total consumption expenditure for 2004-05 and 2009-10 for Rural and Agricultural Labour Households at All India level and States/Union Territories level.

ANNUAL AVERAGE CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

Table 3.1 below shows estimates of annual average consumption expenditure for Rural Labour Households and Agricultural Labour Households during 2009-10.

(i) Rural Labour Households

- 3.2 The Table 3.1 reveals that at all India level, the average annual consumption expenditure for Rural Labour Households was Rs.41,850 in 2009-10, which was higher by 67.19% over 2004-05 estimates of Rs.25,032.
- 3.3 Among the states, annual average consumption expenditure for Rural Households during 2009-10 was the highest in Nagaland (Rs.89,454) and the lowest in Orissa (Rs.29,545). Among Union Territories, Lakshadweep had the highest annual expenditure of Rs.79,088 and the lowest was in Chandigarh (Rs.33,964).

Table 3.2 (a) gives the distribution of States/Union Territories by ranges of annual expenditure for Rural Labour Households during 2009-10.

It may be seen from Table 3.2(a) that in majority of the States/Union Territories, the annual expenditure reported by Rural Labour Households ranged between Rs.35,000 to Rs.55,000. Annual expenditure in 4 States/UTs Viz. Nagaland, Lakshadweep, A&N Island and Kerala falls in the highest range of above Rs.75,000. The annual consumption expenditure for Rural Labour Households in 23 States/Union Territories was above the national average of Rs.41,850. It was below all-India average in 12 States/Union Territories as shown in table 3.1. Annual average consumption expenditure of Rural Labour Households for 17 major states is given in chart-A.

(ii) Agricultural Labour Households

- 3.4 The all India average annual consumption expenditure for Agricultural Labour Households was estimated at Rs. 38,318 in 2009-10 as compared to Rs.22,995 in 2004-05 which showed an increase of 66.64 percent.
- 3.5 The annual average consumption expenditure for All Agricultural Labour Households at state level has also shown similar trend as that of Rural Labour Households. During 2009-10, among States, the average annual expenditure for Agricultural Labour Households ranged between Rs.88,867 in Jammu & Kashmir and Rs.27,510 in Orissa. Among UTs, Lakshadweep has the highest annual average expenditure of Rs.1,04,765 and the lowest was recorded in D & N Haveli (Rs.33,722). The average expenditure in Jammu & Kashmir and Lakshadweep was abnormally high probably due to statistical limitations of a small sample size for Agricultural Labour. Table 3.2(b) gives the distribution of States/Union Territories by ranges of annual expenditure for Agricultural Labour Households during 2009-10.

As reveals in the above Table that Odisha (Rs.27,510), Madhya Pradesh (Rs.31,384), Chhattisgarh (Rs.31,582), D.N. Haveli (Rs.33,722), Sikkim (Rs.34,011) and Jharkhand (Rs.34,662) are lowest in the annual expenditure range of (Rs.25,000-35,000) and Jammu & Kashmir, Delhi, and Lakshadweep are in the highest range (above Rs.75,000). It also reveals that 23 States/Union territories have average annual consumption expenditure higher than the national average of Rs.38,318 and annual consumption expenditure of remaining States/UTs is below the national average.

Annual average consumption expenditure of Agricultural Labour Households for 17 major states is given in chart-B.

PER CAPITA AVERAGE ANNUAL EXPENDITURE

(i) Rural Labour Households

3.6 At all-India level, the per capita annual consumption expenditure of Rural Labour Households was Rs. 9341.52 in 2009-10. State-wise per capita annual expenditure was the highest in Kerala (Rs.17559.95) and the lowest in Bihar (Rs.6873.36). Table 3.3 gives the state-wise per capita expenditure for Rural Labour Households in descending order, which reveals that the per capita expenditure of Rural Labour Households in 10 States was below the national average of Rs.9341.52.

(ii) Agricultural Labour Households

3.7 The per capita annual consumption expenditure for Agricultural Labour Households at All India level was Rs.8748.40 in 2009-10 which was comparatively less than that of Rural Labour Households (Rs.9341.52). The per capita annual consumption expenditure (APCE) for Agricultural Labour Households was the highest in the State of Jammu & Kashmir (Rs.15428.30) and the lowest in Odisha (Rs.6534.44). State-wise per capita annual consumption expenditure for Agricultural Labour Households in descending order is given in Table 3.4. The table shows that majority of states/UTs have higher annual per capita expenditure than the national average of Rs.8748.40.

- 3.9 It is evident from the table above that the Rural Labour Households spend major proportion of their expenditure on food items. During the year 2009-10, the proportion of expenditure on food items however, declined to 56.2 percent as compared to 57.7 percent observed during 2004-05. Besides food, the proportion of expenditure on fuel & light, and stimulants & intoxicants has also shown declining trend. The proportionate expenditure in respect of clothing, bedding & footwear and services & miscellaneous group registered an increase at all-India level. House rent expenditure however remained stationery at 0.4 %.
- 3.10 The classification of annual average expenditure on consumption items of ALHs also reveals similar trend as observed in respect of Rural Labour households. The proportion of total expenditure on food items was 59.1% for Agricultural Labour Households in 2004-05 which now declined to 57.2% in 2009-10. There is an increase in the proportion of expenditure on clothing, bedding & footwear and miscellaneous & services, whereas it showed a declining trend for fuel & light and stimulants & intoxicants. However, the proportion of expenditure on house rent group remained constant at 0.2% for ALHs in 2009-10.
- 3.11 Percentage break up of consumption expenditure during 2004-05 and 2009-10 at all-India level for Rural Labour Households and Agricultural Labour Households is depicted in Pie Chart C.
- 3.12 The pattern of distribution of annual consumption expenditure among different group of items in various states also depicted more or less the same picture as depicted at the all India level. The distribution of expenditure between food and non-food items in respect of the Rural Labour Households and Agricultural Labour Households in different states is given in Table 3.6.

3.13 Table 3.6 reveals that in all the states there is preponderance of food-group items in the total consumption expenditure of both Rural Labour Households and Agricultural Labour Households but with significant variability among themselves. There are States/UTs like Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Karnataka, Odisha, Tripura, West Bengal etc., which have higher expenditure on food than the All- India average of 56.2% whereas States/UTs like Chhattisgarh, Jammu & Kashmir, Kerala, Punjab, Tamil Nadu etc., have expenditure on food items lower than the all-India average. Higher percentage of expenditure on food items in some of these states is difficult to explain. Probably it may be due to the preponderance of migrant labour in these states that follow the pattern of living of their place of origin. The pattern in respect of the Agricultural Labour Households is also almost similar to RLHs.

SUB GROUP WISE BREAK UP OF EXPENDITURE ON FOOD ITEMS

- 3.14 Statements 3.2 (a) & (b) present the sub-group wise break up of average annual expenditure per household on food items for the Rural and Agricultural Labour Households. At all India level, the annual average consumption of food items for Rural Labour Households has gone up from Rs.14451.19 in 2004-05 to Rs.23539.80 in 2009-10 registering an increase of 62.9%. In case of Agricultural Labour Households, it also increased to Rs.21937.90 in 2009-10 as compared to Rs.13602.58 in 2004-05 shown an increase of 61.3%.
- 3.15 A comparative picture of annual average expenditure during 2009-10 and 2004-05 of Rural Labour Households and Agricultural Labour Households on sub-groups of food group is given in the Table 3.7.

3.16 The above Table revealed that the proportion of annual consumption expenditure on all sub-groups of food group, except "Cereals & Products'; 'Oils & Fats; and 'Condiments & spices', has increased in 2009-10 as compared to 2004-05 indicating there by a shift in consumption pattern of labour households in rural areas over a period of time from cereals to non-cereal items.

The consumption expenditure in respect of cereals and non-cereal items of food group for Rural and Agricultural Labour Households is also depicted in the pie chart D.

3.18 Table 3.8 reflects a significant variation across states in respect of percentage of expenditure of the Rural Labour Households on cereals among the food items. The percentage expenditure on cereals in food items was higher than the national average (31.0%) in the States like Arunachal Pradesh (34.0%), Assam (40.8%), Bihar (45.2%), Chhattisgarh (32.5%), Jammu & Kashmir (32.3%) Jharkhand (42.7%), Madhya Pradesh (33.2%), Manipur (57.9%), Meghalaya 33.2%), Nagaland (40.6%), Odisha (39.0%), Tripura (34.6%), Uttar Pradesh (33.7%) and West Bengal (37.7%). It was lower than all-India average in the States of Haryana (19.6%), Punjab (20.1%), Tamil Nadu (21.2%), Goa (21.4%) and Gujarat (23.1%) etc. The pattern in respect of the Agricultural Labour Households has also shown a similar trend.

TRENDS IN CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE PATTERNS DURING THE PERIOD 1974-75 TO 2009-10

- 3.19 The pattern of consumption expenditure during the period 1974-75 to 2009-10 is given in Table 3.9.
- 3.20 The pattern of consumption expenditure during the last 35 years has revealed that there has been a declining trend in the share of food items as well as cereal items in the total expenditure of Rural as well as Agricultural Labour Households. It is observed from Table 3.9 that in respect of RLHs, the share of food which was 78.4% during 1974-75 had steadily declined in the subsequent enquiries and reached at 56.2 % during 2009-10. Similarly, expenditure on cereals as percentage of total expenditure also declined from the level of 54.1% during 1974-75 to 17.4% in 2009-10. Similar declining trend was also observed in respect of Agricultural Labour Households.




CONSUMPTION OF CEREALS IN QUANTITY TERMS

3.21 Statements 3.3(a) & 3.3(b) indicate per capita daily consumption of cereals (in gms.) at states as well as at all-India level for Rural Labour Households and Agricultural Labour Households respectively. The per capita daily consumption of cereals in case of Rural Labour Households has gone down from 394 gms. in 2004-05 to 371 gms. in 2009-10. Similarly, the per capita daily consumption of cereals for Agricultural Labour Households also declined from 397 gms. in 2004-05 to 372 gms. in 2009-10. Among major States, it was highest in Odisha (458 gms.) and the lowest in Gujarat and Punjab (309 gms.) for Rural Labour Household and for Agricultural Labour Household it was highest in Odisha (458 gms.) and lowest in Kerala and Punjab (317 gms.). The in-take of different cereals in respect of Rural/Agricultural Labour Households for 2004-05 and 2009-10 is depicted in pie chart E.

Annual Average Consumption Expenditure of Agricultural Labour Households for 17 Chart B Major States (2009-10)





Annual Average Expenditure on different Item Groups (Percentage Distribution)










